Students who participated in a different lesson prepared a short presentation in English about the company and the product produced by this company to the Erasmus + project CASE partners during the meeting in our gymnasium on May 26-31, 2017.



Eco – creative workshop


During the meeting of CASE partners on May 26-31, 2017 in Druskininkai, the project participants used secondary materials to create art installations and the elements of decor.

Project Activities:

One day event of "Creativity through recycling" took place at TICAL in May 2017. Students exhibited their creativity by repurposing materials. A poster was created for the event; students, parents, locals and directors from Tepebaşı District Directorate of National Education have visited exhibitions. Plastics, old clothes, unused stationary, cans, buttons and old yarns were transformed into shopping bags, pencil holders, pillows, toys and bookcases. The event has been successful in two dimensions - avoiding one's actions of prompt shopping and unfolding creativity.
